PUBLIC RELATIONS Trustee Petri presented the Governing Board Recognition Award to LINK Crew

> from West Valley High School. Teachers Kathleen Alvarez, Alex Ballard and Paul Bailey were present to receive crystal clocks and a check for \$500 for the LINK Crew program. Mrs. Alvarez indicated that the check would be used for orientation assembly supplies and expenses. LINK Crew student leaders also

attended the presentation.

Trustee Gosch provided recognition of the Hemet High and West Valley High Schools' Academic Decathlon Teams. Mr. Eric Gosch presented \$500 checks to team captains Becky Shawver, Hemet High School, and Alex Ballard, West Valley High School. Student members of both teams also attended the

recognition.

STUDENT REPRESENTATIVES' REPORT

Callie Bundrant, Student Representative for Hemet High School mentioned Academic Decathlon's recent success, Mock Trial events going outstandingly well, the Cheer Team taking first place in Aloha Spirit International in Hawaii and the Dance Team taking first in the Golden Classic and both teams are now moving on to National's. Girl's Soccer won their first CIF game, and Boy's Soccer and Basketball went to CIF. The Winter Formal went well, the Military Ball is this upcoming weekend and Prom will be May 15 at Palm Valley Country Club in Palm Desert. The month of March brings the Multi-Cultural Fair, a visit by students from Kushimoto, Japan, a Fine Arts Assembly, and a Pennies for Patients fundraiser (for Leukemia/Lymphoma patients). The Youth Council for Community Improvement applied for and received a grant for \$2,500 and they will come back to the Board at a later date to make a presentation.

Dani Renwick, West Valley High School Student Representative, was not present.

HEARING SECTION

Tony Weissmer and a number of other students from West Valley High School FFA gave an overview of events and awards won at the Date Festival in Indio February 13 – 22. They exhibited many ribbons, awards, plaques and pictures. 48 students exhibited 96 entries and earned over \$23,000 in premiums and the Junior Livestock Auction.

Sandy Caplan, Special Education teacher at Winchester School spoke regarding her concerns about the pressures of testing on special education students.

Albert Martin, Principal, Winchester School, thanked the Educational Services staff for the work they are doing and the support they provide to school sites.

Carol Peji spoke on behalf of her deaf son, Dennis, in regard to the lengthy bus ride he has to take every day to his school in Nuview. She requested help in finding a solution to the long ride. Staff will investigate.

Sue Fox spoke regarding problems with speeders on West Thornton in the area of Harmony School. She asked for crosswalks and crossing guards. Staff will investigate.
