INFORMATION ITEMS There were no informational items presented.

ITEMS BY THE GOVERNING BOARD

Mr. Sanborn requested that legal counsel look into what recourse the District might have regarding senior housing developments which have received a waiver from paying school fees, and then transfer to family housing without school fees being paid.

Mr. Cook indicated he would like to get staff input on available options in addition to input from legal counsel and that staff work with the city and county regarding senior housing developments. He asked that staff explore how other districts have handled this situation.

Mr. Peters stated he felt it was not fair of the District to advertise for Citizens Oversight Committee and then make a selection of a current committee member. He also thought that this item was to be brought back to the Board. He stated the Board should make the appointment decisions, not the selection committee.

Mrs. Jones stated she was in favor of committees but in the case of Citizen's Oversight, the process didn't work, and she was uncomfortable with the way the appointments were handled. She indicated that the Board needed to review the appointments and she would like to see eleven members appointed to the committee instead of nine.

Mr. Sanborn requested that the Citizens Oversight Committee appointment be placed on the next agenda because it had been tabled to be brought back.

Mr. Cook requested that a discussion item be agendized on board committee processes.

Mr. Sanborn requested that Dr. Pendley call the Citizens Oversight Committee applicants to inform them that the Board would reconsider the appointments at a future meeting and to determine if they were still interested in being considered.

Mrs. Jones asked for clarification on student athletic physicals and that chiropractors are not considered "medical practitioners" for the purpose of administering physicals to student athletes. Following discussion, it was determined that a chiropractor is not defined as a "medical practitioner" and a process would be set in place whereby a student athlete physical clinic by a "medical practitioner" would be arranged by the District as an option for students having difficulty getting a physical scheduled.

ITEMS BY THE SUPERINTENDENT

Dr. Pendley called the Board's attention to a draft questionnaire regarding a phone survey for a school bond and asked board members to review and get back to him with edits by Tuesday of the next week.

ADJOURNMENT Motion No. 976 On a motion by Mr. Cook, seconded by Mrs. Jones, the Governing Board voted unanimously to adjourn the meeting at 7:24 p.m.
